ACCOMPLISHMENTS

FY18

- On our annual monitoring visit from the Virginia Department of Social Services in March 2018, we had a completely deficiency free report to renew our three-year license for our day center – the highest level of licensure for adult day health services in Virginia.
- The early stage Reconnections added a fourth day of programming! 46 individuals had the opportunity for peer support and socialization in a safe, nonjudgmental setting. The program provides discussion groups, recreational therapies, and learning experiences for those with MCI or who are in the early stages of a memory impairment.
- 3. Christi Clark represented Insight at the International Association of Gerontology and Geriatrics (IAGG) World Conference in San Francisco in July 2017. She was a part of a joint presentation with George Mason University to report on the positive outcomes of the Music and Memory program for our participants.
- 4. After careful analysis through our person-centered care initiatives, Insight created three distinct levels of care within our day center to meet the needs of participants through care and structured programming that better match the cognitive levels and abilities of everyone attending.
- 5. Held our sixth annual "Paintings & Pairings" at the Fairview Park Marriott on October 26, 2017. The event was bigger than ever; nearly 400 guests enjoyed a wonderful evening of paired hors d'oeuvres with seasonal wines, a three-course seated dinner, local artwork for sale, and silent and live auction items, raising over \$70,000 in support of our center.

- 6. Insight participated in providing a total of 65 free education programs for caregivers in Northern Virginia. Topics covered a wide range of caregiving issues, and brought in experts in their respective fields. New Caregiver Engagement Workshops were added to provide hands-on training for family caregivers.
- 7. Insight continues our work with George Mason University to promote the Music & Memory program. Our participants, caregivers, and staff have helped their researchers create training videos that can be used to start the program at facilities across the region.
- Insight provided over \$205,000 in financial assistance to 18 participants and their families.
- 9. Insight was selected to receive probono services to create an outcomes database that will better track our day center participant engagement and interventions. This data will be collected over the next fiscal year to help continually improve our programming and develop widespread day center best practice outcomes.
- 10. The winner of our second annual Excellence in Memory Care Award was announced at the Paintings & Pairings event. The award went to Larmax Homes for their innovative equine therapy program.
- 11. The Memory Café, having grown to twice a month, proved a popular offering of group activities, support group for caregivers, and a joint dinner at the conclusion. 63 individuals participated.
- 12. Numerous **family and friends supported Insight** at the Fairfax
 County Board of Supervisors budget
 hearing in April 2018 to advocate for
 continued funding.

- 13. Joel Bednoski and Christi Clark represented Insight at the National Adult Day Services Conference in September 2017, presenting on promoting the benefits of adult day health centers.
- 14. Offered three different support groups throughout the year to best meet the needs of different caregiving situations. 436 caregivers attended a total of 54 sessions.
- 15. **Celebrate Insight**, held in May 2018, was a fun spring carnival to honor loved ones and celebrate the care Insight provides to the community.
- 16. 100 volunteers and interns provided 6,475 hours of service during the fiscal year. We are grateful to partner with several universities including George Mason, Marymount, and Stratford to provide students with practical experience.
