While there have been many days that we wished for a bigger space to come overnight - when we have had to place a deserving family at number 15 on the waitlist for the day program, or when staff has to vacate an office to make room for a private family consultation. However, growth cannot come simply for growth's sake, it must be deliberate, judicious-and most of all-beneficial for our families.

In the midst of vetting potential sites, running budget numbers, and evaluating our needs for space, we have also taken a step back to look at why we are growing. Was it just for swanky new offices and the latest technology? Staff and board members took a hard look at our mission. vision, values, and strategic plan through this process, and determined why we want to move. We care. We care that participants have to be put on a waitlist to receive the care they need. We care that support groups and education programs have to be capped for lack of chairs and room space. We care that there is unmet need in the communityand we want to meet it. Our growth and expansion is not for us, but for the growing need in the community.

Rest assured, we're not just waiting for the bigger space to fall in our laps overnight. Plans are underway for an expansion, and in the meantime we're expanding all we can in the current space. This year we have become a Certified Music & Memory Care Facility, providing participants with individualized music playlists to calm anxiety, and reawaken the senses. We participated in an innovative physical therapy study on balance and gait, and found out the results of a previous study, the Daily Stress and Health of Caregivers, that use of adult day services reduces caregiver risks for illness. We have brought on a full time Education and Outreach Coordinator who is already planning great new programs and training opportunities for our families.

We're doing all we can to meet the need today, and we're more excited than ever for what the future will bring.

# Programs & Services

In keeping with our mission, Alzheimer's Family Day Center strives to provide a comprehensive spectrum of care, support and education to those affected by Alzheimer's disease and other memory impairments throughout the course of the disease process.

Located in Fairfax, Virginia, our programs are open to anyone in the DC metro area, and our caregiving resources are used across the country.

## CARE

The **Mind and Body Workshop** is designed specifically for families that have received a recent diagnosis or are in the early stages. The program focuses on maximizing capabilities, while also providing caregivers with new ways to interact and adjust to the changing family dynamics.

Our **Adult Day Health Program** provides a safe, engaging, and therapeutic environment for people with memory impairment in mid to late stages. It is the only dementiaspecific day center in the DC metro area and still the only adult day health center in Northern Virginia with programs for people in the later stages of an Alzheimer's illness.

## SUPPORT

As families are also affected by the disease, AFDC offers support groups, consultations, and home visits to reduce caregiver stress and provide practical solutions to challenges

Support Groups offer people in like circumstances the chance to share practical advice, discuss frustrations and fears and connect with others who are on a similar journey in a secure group environment. AFDC can provide Individual Consultation to discuss a family's specific needs or challenges and make recommendations of area resources that may be appropriate. Home Visits can also provide additional insight for families on a safe living environment.

Trained as a Certified Music & Memory Care Facility, AFDC provides participants with personalized music playlists.



Daily Stress and Health Study Our caregivers participated in a Penn State study showing reduced caregiver stress with Day center use.



Scholarship AFDC provided almost \$130,000 in financial assistance to 20 participant families in FY13.

## EDUCATION

AFDC's innovative education programs help family members remain confident and effective in their caregiving roles and increase understanding of the disease in the community.

**Classes for Caregivers** are offered to build skills and confidence while learning more about Alzheimer's resources in the community. AFDC also offers a variety of **Community Training** options to businesses, professional groups, service organizations, and faith communities regarding current topics in Alzheimer's disease and caregiving. In addition, our publication, "**Caregiving at a Glance**" provides strategies for managing behavior challenges and planning for future care.

#### HONORS

AFDC holds a three-year license, the highest level of licensure in Virginia.

AFDC was honored to be granted a 2012 Top-Rated Award, from GreatNonprofits, with all 5 star reviews from our families, board members, and volunteers.

AFDC was selected as one of the top 30 favorite charities in the Washington Region by Exxon Mobil.

#### FROM A FAMILY: SHARING HOPE

Thank you AFDC for everything you're doing for our mother!

As her children, we remember how our mom had always been a social butterfly of sorts – flitting about her network of nieces, nephews, church friends, and neighbors. She was always eager to share her joy. However, shortly after our dad passed, our mom suffered a TIA stroke and other hardships which aggravated her dementia to a point where she was often depressed and had no interest in interacting with friends and family.

For over three years, we sought professional guidance, counseling through her pastor, and other supportive assistance for her (as well as ourselves), but made very little progress in improving her outlook in life. Having dementia is bad, but having no hope is worse.

Then we found AFDC.

Our mom started attending AFDC – first in the Mind and Body Workshop and now in the Day Center program. Since joining, we have noticed a tremendous change in her. Outwardly, the biggest difference is her smile, a smile we have not seen in over 3 years. She is excited to tell us about her day, the art work she has done, the music she's listened to, and of course, the dancing. Inwardly, the biggest change in her is the same change in us children – now we have hope. Thank you so very much, AFDC, for all you have done, and continue to do, for our mother...and us!
